Happy May Day!!!
As I am writing
this on March 30th
with the weather
predicted to be
barely above
freezing and 13
inches of snow in

the forecast, I am looking forward to **May** showers bringing May flowers. May is the time of year when we get into full swing with our construction season. It is also the time when all of us "rise out of hibernation" and start work on our own projects. As such, I thought perhaps some safety reminders are in order.

As you work on your own projects:

- Remember to call before you dig! Dial 811 to request a locator to your dig site. They will ensure everything is well marked so you can avoid digging into any dangerous cables. This locating service is paid by Itasca-Mantrap and is free to the public.
- If you have a tree trimming project, remember to locate our overhead lines to make sure there is plenty of clearance. If the tree stands near our lines or appears it may fall close to them, please call us, we would be happy to do the trimming for you. This, again, is a free service for our members.
- If you have a project that entails moving our meter or our lines, even if temporarily, do not

attempt to move them on your own. Call us. There may be a minimal cost to you depending on your needs.

- If your project involves a delivery of sand or dirt, please be sure to check for clearance from our overhead lines. The height of the truck as it is dumping is such that it will hit our line if there is not sufficient clearance. This also applies to other tall trucks and equipment. Are you pouring concrete or building a tree stand? Watch out for our lines!
- If you need any electrical work, be sure to call a licensed electrician.
 At the very least, shut off the electricity at the breaker box before starting your project.
- In general, keep electrical safety in mind as you work to complete that list of projects you have been dreaming about all winter long.

As you encounter our linemen working around our service territory:

- Please stay clear of their work area.
 You never know what hazards they are working with.
- If our utility truck is stopped along the road, we ask you to please move to the other lane and allow us some room (did you know this is a state law?).
- Please be patient during power outages. Although we are as eager as you are to get the power back on, we are committed to safety first.

Above all, remember electricity is extremely dangerous.

- If you see a downed line, report it to us immediately and stay clear.
 Remember the ground may be just as dangerous as touching the wire.
- If you are in a car accident and a line is touching the vehicle, stay inside the vehicle until we shut off the power. If there is danger of the vehicle starting on fire, be sure to jump as far as you can from the vehicle landing on both feet at once and shuffle away from the scene.

Itasca-Mantrap has had a great safety record. We would all like to keep it that way. So my advice to you, as we all gear up for project season is to be careful around electricity. It is dangerous.



The incumbent directors from Districts 1, 2, and 3 submitted the necessary paperwork for election to the Itasca-Mantrap Board of Directors and were certified as the duly nominated candidates for election during Itasca-Mantrap's 82nd Annual Meeting on June 13.

Being the only candidates to submit documents for their districts, the incumbents will be elected by acclamation pursuant to Itasca-Mantrap bylaws, Article III, Section 3, which states, "In the event there is only one candidate duly nominated for election to a Director position for a district, the single candidate nominated shall be deemed elected by acclamation as an unopposed candidate." All directors will serve a three-year term.



May is Electrical Safety Month

Electricity plays many roles in our lives, from powering baby monitors, cell phones and lighting, to running HVAC systems and appliances. Electricity provides comfort with its instant availability and when we flip a switch, we expect most systems or devices to do the job.

May is National Electrical Safety Month, a great time to look around your home and check for potential safety hazards. According to the Consumer Product Safety Commission, approximately 51,000 electrical fires are reported each year in the United States, causing more than \$1.3 billion in annual property damage.

Electricity is an essential necessity for modern living, and Itasca-Mantrap is committed to providing safe, reliable and affordable power to all of our members.

A Safe, Happy House

Four Easy Ways to Boost Electrical Safety at Home

DON'T

place flammable items, like potholders, napkins or dish towels near the stove while cooking.





DO

keep electrical devices away from water to prevent electric shock.



DO

ensure you're using the correct wattage in all light fixtures.



DON'T

overload electrical outlets with more devices than the circuit can handle.

4 Temporary Power Safety





Temporary wiring should be designed and installed according to OSHA, NEC, and NFPA 70E requirements.



Temporary power must be installed by a qualified electrician.





Temporary power equipment should be located on a worksite protected from vehicle traffic, accessible only to authorized persons, and suitable for the environmental conditions that may be present.

Energy Efficiency Tip of the Month

The location of your thermostat can impact your HVAC system's ability to maintain an ideal indoor temperature. For maximum accuracy, thermostats should be placed in the center of the home, away from air vents, plumbing pipes and exterior doors. Avoid placing items like lamps and televisions near your thermostat. which can cause the HVAC to run longer than necessary. Avoid installing thermostats in rooms that tend to feel warmer or colder than the rest of the home. Do not place furniture in front of the thermostat. which can block air flow and result in inaccurate readings.





Summer Residential Rates

Itasca-Mantrap's summer electric rates will go into effect in June. The general service rate for June, July and August is 12 cents per kilowatt-hour (kWh), compared to 10 cents per kWh from September through May. The Basic Charge for residential services is \$38 per month throughout the year.
