CEO UPDATE

The holiday season is just around the corner, and soon festive music will flood the airwaves, sparkling lights and decorations will adorn homes and businesses, and good tidings will abound.

The holidays also bring a frenzy of decorating, cooking, and family gatherings. Amid the hectic hustle and bustle, you may receive higher than usual energy bills. Keeping this in mind, I thought this month would be an opportune time to provide tips to help lower your monthly energy use:

- Make minor, low-cost improvements, like weatherstripping exterior doors and caulking around old drafty windows.
- Use LED holiday lights. They use 88% less energy than incandescent holiday lights. The Department of Energy estimates that standard holiday decorations using incandescent lights increases your energy bill by \$33 or more. In contrast, LED lights typically cost only about \$5 to \$7 to run. Now, if you go above and beyond with incandescent holiday lighting (think Clark Griswold), your energy bills could increase by as much as \$350. LEDs are also shockresistant, shatterproof, and cool to the touch, making them safer for your home.
- Manage your holiday lighting with a smart light timer, or if you do not have smart home technology, any timer will do.
- Turn off overhead lights and use your holiday lighting to illuminate your home.

- If you have a fireplace, remember to close the flue when it is not in use to ensure heat does not escape through the chimney.
- Use small countertop appliances like microwaves, air fryers and slow cookers when possible. They use much less energy than the stovetop or oven.
- Bake multiple dishes at once when using the oven. It takes the same amount of energy to bake one dish as it does to bake several.
- Turn the oven off a few minutes before the recipe's end time and allow the residual heat to finish baking the dish.
- Once the food is done, leave the oven door ajar to allow the residual heat to warm the room.
- When using the stove top, match the pan size to the burner to maximize the stove top's efficiency.

I hope a few of these tips will be helpful as we approach the holiday season. If you have questions about managing energy or your monthly bill, we are always happy to help.



Sales Tax Exemption

Members who use electricity as their primary source of residential heat are exempt from paying taxes on the electricity purchased during the billing months of November through April.

If more than one type of heat is used, electricity is not taxable, but only if it is the primary source of heat for the longest period of time during the heating season.

To apply for the sales tax exemption, Members must complete the exemption form, available at our office or at www.itasca-mantrap.com. If you have already applied for a sales tax exemption, there is no need to re-apply; your enrollment will automatically carry forward each year.

Cogenerators and Small Power Producers



Itasca-Mantrap Electric Cooperative will interconnect with and purchase electricity from cogenerators and small power producers who satisfy the conditions of a qualifying facility. Itasca-Mantrap will provide information to all interested Members, upon request, regarding rates and interconnection requirements.

An application for interconnection is required for a qualifying facility to interconnect and operate in parallel with the Cooperative's distribution system and is subject to approval by the Cooperative. Any disputes over interconnection, sales and purchases are subject to resolution by the Itasca-Mantrap Electric Cooperative Board.

Load Control Notifications


Stay updated when load management takes place.

Load management is a cost-savings approach to curtail the peak demand of electric energy to allow better use of existing generating capacity. Lowering the peak benefits all members by reducing our wholesale power costs. These savings are passed along to participating members through lower rates on our dual fuel and off-peak programs.

New systems may also be eligible for installation rebates. Contact our office to learn more about our load management programs.




Welcome to Brittany Edelman!
