## **Director Nominations** Open



**DISTRICT 5** – includes Arago, Blueberry, Green Valley, Straight River, and Todd Townships.

Completed petitions and forms must be received in the Itasca-Mantrap office by 4:30 p.m. on Monday, April 11.





### **CEO Update** - By Christine Fox, President-CEO

There has been a lot of talk about climate change and emissions targets over the years in places like Paris, Washington D.C., and St. Paul.

But did you know, there has been a lot of action taking place in Park Rapids? And it is benefiting families and businesses within our territory. Your electricity is getting significantly cleaner while remaining safe, reliable, and affordable.

Itasca-Mantrap is on the path to clean energy, and we believe Itasca-Mantrap's members have the best electric service around, whether you value cost, reliability, environmental responsibility—or all three.

In partnership with our wholesale electricity provider, Great River Energy (GRE), Itasca-Mantrap will dramatically reduce the energy we receive from coal. Next year, we

will meet Minnesota's goal to reduce carbon dioxide emissions by 80% from 2005 levels—27 years before the 2050 target. Yes, incredibly, I said 27 years!

Further, our renewable energy portfolio – which already meets Minnesota's renewable energy standard of 25% – will nearly triple in output by 2025.

This strategic shift to change the way GRE generates electricity has occurred intentionally for over a decade, demonstrated by the closure of two power plants and the recent sale of a third. These advances toward clean energy have allowed GRE's wholesale power rate to remain flat and is projected to remain flat for years to come, despite recent inflation.

Since wholesale power is expected to remain flat, and with wholesale power being Itasca-Mantrap's largest expenditure, this is great news for Itasca-Mantrap members. That being said, I cannot predict what will happen to Itasca-Mantrap rates to our members due to inflationary costs of

other Itasca-Mantrap expenditures. However, I can say that any rate increases will be much less dramatic than would have otherwise occurred.

Itasca-Mantrap and Great River Energy are in the strong position we are today because of the way we do business, as cooperatives. Cooperatives are owned by those we serve, governed by democratically elected directors, and guided by a simple goal: to do what's best for the membership, in every scenario. We are an owner of Great River Energy in the same way you are an owner of Itasca-Mantrap. Your Itasca-Mantrap directors have faced decisions that will have wideranging and long-lasting effects. They take into careful consideration the impact their decisions will have on the environment, reliability, community, and the state and local economy. Through it all, they have focused on doing what's best for Itasca-Mantrap's membership. By continuing to listen to our members and work with partners like Great River Energy, Itasca-Mantrap will remain innovative and nimble and deliver on our promise to members for generations.

Thank you for allowing me to serve you.

# **Board Report: Meeting Highlights**

The regular meeting of the Board of Directors for Itasca-Mantrap Co-op. Electrical Ass'n. was held on Thursday, January 27, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. at the Itasca-Mantrap office.

A quorum of directors was present.

Items discussed or Board action taken:

- Approved the consent agenda.
- Heard the Operations and Safety report and the Marketing and Member Services report.
- December financials were received and filed subject to audit.
- CEO Christine Fox gave her monthly CEO report.
- Heard quarterly reports for Board Expenses, Strategic Plan, Safety Incidents, Financial Ratios and Vegetation Management.
- Approved the retirement of Itasca-Mantrap capital credits through 2004 and Great River Energy (GRE) capital credits through 1992, totaling \$1,061,721.99, not including estate retirements.
- Approved the Average Retail Cooperative Energy Rates (ARCER) for residential, small commercial, large commercial and irrigation accounts.
- Reviewed the 2021 Distributed Energy Resource Facilities report.
- Approved revisions to Board Policy 7.14 – Identity Theft Prevention Program and adopted Board Policy 7.20 – Member Privacy and Confidentiality.
- Reviewed plans for Strategic Planning sessions in March 2022.
- Approved a vote in favor of changes to GRE's transaction to sell Coal Creek Station and the HVDC system.
- Approved a vote in favor of GRE's wind energy purchase.
- Designated Director Utke as delegate for a GRE special meeting on February 9, 2022.
- Directors and CEO Christine Fox reported on meetings attended on behalf of the Cooperative.

An underground utility line is damaged once every 9 minutes because someone didn't call 811.



811 locators **do not detect** underground sprinkler systems, invisible fences, data communication systems, private water systems, or gas piping to a garage.

Call 811, the "Call Before You Dig Number," at least 2 business days prior to digging.



Even if you have previously had underground utilities marked, utilities can shift, so it's best to call before starting a new project.




# Energy Efficiency Tip of the Month

Streaming content with electronic equipment that has earned the ENERGY STAR® rating will use 25% to 30% less energy than standard equipment.
