# **CEO Update** - By Christine Fox, President-CEO

Now that summer is almost here, I am looking forward to more opportunities to be outdoors and enjoy the warmer weather. Summertime brings about many

of my favorite activities like cooking out with family and friends, afternoons on the water, and enjoying life.

Summer months also make conditions right for dangerous storms. These potential weather events can cause destruction to our electrical system, but I want you to know that Itasca-Mantrap crews are ready and standing by to respond should power outages occur in our area.

When major storms knock out power, our crews take all necessary precautions before they work on any downed lines. I would encourage you to also practice safety and preparedness to protect your family during major storms and outages.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency provides recommendations, listed below, that are a great starting point for storm and disaster preparedness. Visit www.ready.gov for additional resources:

- Stock your pantry with a three-day supply of non-perishable food, such as canned goods, energy bars, peanut butter, powdered milk, instant coffee, water, and other essentials (i.e., diapers and toiletries).
- Confirm that you have adequate sanitation and hygiene supplies including towelettes, soap and hand sanitizer.
- Ensure your First Aid kit is stocked with pain relievers, bandages, and other medical essentials. And make sure your prescriptions are current.
- Set aside basic household items you will need, including flashlights, batteries, a manual can opener and a portable, battery-powered radio or TV.
- Organize emergency supplies so they are easily accessible in one location.

In the event of a prolonged power outage, turn off major appliances, TVs, computers, and other sensitive electronics. This will help avert damage from a power surge and will also help prevent overloading the circuits during power restoration. If you plan to use

a small generator, make sure it is rated to handle the amount of power you will need, and always review the manufacturer's instructions to operate it safely.

Listen to local news or NOAA Weather Radio for storm and emergency information and be sure to check Itasca-Mantrap's website or Facebook page for power restoration updates.

After the storm, avoid downed power lines and walking through flooded areas where power lines could be submerged. Allow ample room for utility crews to safely perform their jobs.

Advanced planning for severe storms or other emergencies can reduce stress and anxiety caused by the weather event and can lessen the impact of the storm's effects. Sign up for NOAA emergency alerts and warnings and download our SmartHub app for ease in reporting an outage.

I am hoping that we make it through the season without a severe storm, but I am preparing just the same. I encourage you to do the same. Have a safe and wonderful summer!!

# Operation Round Up Awards \$50,000

Thanks to the generosity of Itasca-Mantrap Members, the Itasca-Mantrap Operation Round Up® Trust Board recently awarded \$50,000 in Operation Round Up grants for 72 civic projects in the Itasca-Mantrap and surrounding area. Applications were received indicating a total need of more than \$130,000 for 83 community projects. Because of limited funding, all requests could not be granted.

Operation Round Up, a charitable program unique to electric co-ops, is designed to provide financial assistance to non-profit or community-based organizations that demonstrate a commitment to enhancing the quality of life in the local area served by Itasca-Mantrap. Since the program's inception in 2006, Operation Round Up and Itasca-Mantrap members have awarded more than \$1 million to local organizations.



The Operation Round Up Trust Board meets twice a year to select grant recipients from the applications received. The next application deadline is Wednesday, September 15, 2021.




# Co-op Energy Sources














# Itasca-Mantrap Hosts "Week of the Young Child"

The "Week of the Young Child" event brought in just under 50 children & adults - including a couple of our lineworkers' children! The kids had a great time at the event.

Lineworker Kevin George explained the

process to the children before joining his fellow linemen Dan Cox, Parry Eidsmoe, and Chad Grande in a demonstration of how a pole is placed and removed from the ground, and how a lineman reaches the top of the pole by climbing.

Itasca-Mantrap Co-op. Electrical Ass'n. is obligated to interconnect with and purchase electricity from cogenerators and small power producers who satisfy the conditions of a qualifying facility. Itasca-Mantrap will provide information to all interested Members, upon request, regarding rates and interconnection requirements.

An application for interconnection is required for a qualifying facility to interconnect and operate in parallel with the Cooperative's distribution system and is subject to approval by the Cooperative. Any disputes over interconnection, sales and purchases

are subject to resolution by the Itasca-Mantrap Co-op. Electrical Ass'n. Board. Interested Members should contact Itasca-Mantrap at 218-732-3377 or toll free at 888-713-3377.
